

Connie Evashwick, ScD, LFACHE, CPH, CAE

Dr. Connie Evashwick is an Affiliate of George Mason University and the co-editor of the new journal *Frontiers in Public Health Education and Promotion*. She thrives at the nexus of management and academia, health care delivery systems and public health, long-term care and acute care. Dr. Evashwick holds a bachelor's and a master's degree from Stanford University and a master's and doctoral degree from the Harvard School of Public Health. She is credentialed in public health (CPH) and association management (CAE) and is a Lifetime Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives (LFACHE). Her expertise includes the continuum of care and long-term care delivery systems and health professions education. More recently has focused on hospital community benefit, public health systems and international public health.

Dr. Evashwick's multifaceted career has included positions in academia, consulting, association and direct healthcare operations management. She has been vice president of long-term care for two major health care systems and consulted with health systems, hospitals, and long-term care organizations across the nation. Dr. Evashwick has been active in professional societies, including being a Regent of the American College of Healthcare Executives (FACHE) and chair of the (then) Gerontological Health Section of the American Public Health Association. Dr. Evashwick held an endowed chair at California State University Long Beach, served as the Dean of the SLU School of Public Health and Professor of Health Management & Policy, and was the Senior Director of Academic Programs for the Association of Schools of Public Health. She has authored over 112 publications, including twelve books. She has generated and managed over \$10 million in grants from private foundations and federal, state, and local government agencies.
