

## John R. Combes, MD

John is a Senior Vice President at the American Hospital Association (AHA) and the President of the Center for Healthcare Governance (CHG), an AHA affiliate organization. Currently, Dr. Combes serves on the Boards of the Hospital Sisters Health System, a 13 hospital health system in Illinois and Wisconsin and the West Virginia Medical Institute, a multi-state Quality Improvement Organization. He also is a member of the Not-for-Profit Advisory Council of the National Association of Corporate Directors. He lectures frequently on governance and quality.
